

Dr. Andreas Bouroutis is an economist and political scientist (degree Economics from the National University of Athens, MA in Political Analysis from the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki). His PhD from the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki dealt with the different communities of Thessaloniki in the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20 century and their relationship with the European school institutions in the city.

He has taught in the Department of Political Sciences of the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, (Modern Diplomacy and Politics in the Eastern Mediterranean, Political Systems in the Balkans), where he also gives the lecture on migration and refugee issues for the Erasmus course "Greece Today". Currently he is the Scientific Program Leader of the research program "Post-war transformation of Thessaloniki and the fate of the Jewish assets" and a Research Fellow of the program "Business in a transforming city. Entrepreneurship and social process in Thessaloniki (1919-1939)".

He has been a scholar of the DAAD educational exchange program between Greece and Germany in 2013 and a bursary of the Italian State in 2016 and in 2019. In 2014 he was a scholar for the John Latsis Public Foundation for the scientific project "People of the Underworld: ideologies and policies of discrimination, exclusion and prosecution in modern world". In 2018 he was a Postdoctoral Research Fellow at Yad Vashem Holocaust Research Institute in Jerusalem.

Between 2016 and 2018 he was the Deputy Director of the Greek Council for Refugees (GCR). GCR is considered to be among the biggest NGO's in Greece providing legal and psychosocial services to refugees and asylum seekers. He was the head of Thessaloniki's branch leading a team of around 30 practitioners (lawyers, social workers and cultural mediators) and handling more than 6.000 asylum cases.

His academic research among others covers issues of migration and refugee flows in the Balkans and the Mediterranean.
