Brendan Mullan is Associate Professor of Sociology at Michigan State University (MSU). He holds a Ph.D. in Demography from the University of Pennsylvania and a BA (Hons) degree from The Queen's University, Belfast Northern Ireland. His research focuses on the demographic and socio-political processes underlying public policy, international migration, and globalization. He is the author-editor of 3 books and 90+ scholarly and policy-related publications, presentations and reports on demography, international migration, and public policy. His most recent publications include "Emigration and The Sending State" in *The International Handbook of International Migration*, (Routledge, 2019); and "The Sociology of Inequality and the Rise of Neo-Inequality" (*Sociological Focus*, 2017). He teaches Political Sociology, Inequality, Public Policy, and Statistical Methods. For 15+ years, he has co-led the MSU Education Abroad program ("Contemporary Culture, Politics, and Society") on the island of Lesbos. Dr. Mullan was Associate Dean of the MSU College of Social Science (2006-2008) and Executive Director of the MSU Dubai campus in the United Arab Emirates (2008-2010). He was elected President of the American North Central Sociological Association (2016). He is a charter-founding member of the American Sociological Association's section on the Sociology of Development and was elected its first secretary-treasurer.
