Dimitrios-Rafail Tservenis holds a PhD from the School of Political Sciences of the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, where he completed his doctorate in 2021, focusing on migrant integration in the rural areas of Southern Europe. His academic research mainly covers the multi-level governance of migrant integration in Europe and migrants' well-being, with a special focus on Greece and Italy. In the last two years, he has worked mostly for the Center for European Studies and Comparative Politics of Sciences Po (Paris), and specifically for the project ETHMIGSURVEYDATA, which
